exclusions happen every year on average. The most common reason is persistent disruptive behaviour.¹

4 x

more likely to be excluded if you are a student who is eligible for free school meals or if you are Black Caribbean.¹

1%

of students in pupil referral units go on to receive 5 good GCSE grades. This increases the likelihood of excluded students offending due to not having the right qualifications for employment.²

63%

of the prison population has been excluded from school.³
